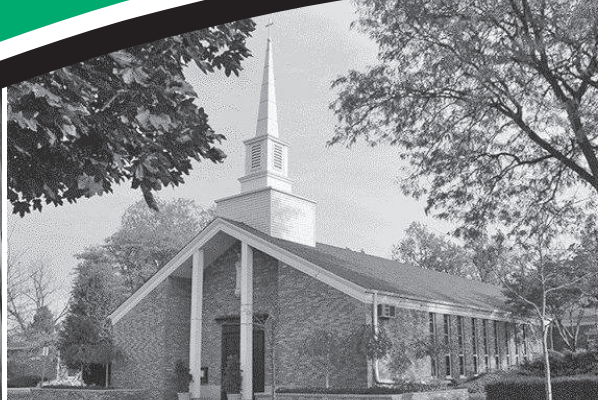
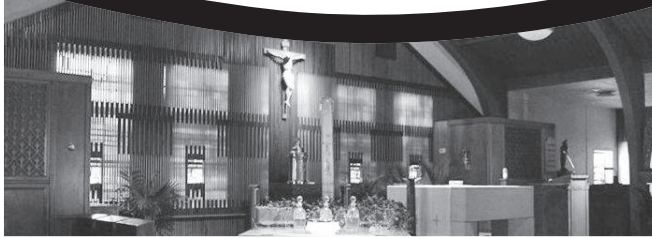

## FAITH FORMATION

Christians are baptized into the Paschal Mystery of Christ's Death and Resurrection for the forgiveness of sin and fullness of salvation. This mystery is celebrated at every Mass, remembering Christ's loving deed and giving thanks and praise to God. By this action the "Sacrifice of the Cross is continuously made present in the Church". (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, No. 72)

One of the principal words with which the tradition has understood the Mass is to speak of it as a sacrifice. The primitive sacrifice of animals, written in the Old Testament was a means of appeasing God as part of the Old Covenant with Him. When Christ submitted to the Jewish Law and extended it outward from there to include all Gentiles, He introduced a new reality to the world, a New Covenant. The new sacrifice of Christians, called "spiritual worship", is our bodies as a living sacrifice. The collection of the gifts, bread, wine and monetary offering, enact this living sacrifice. It can only be done through, with, and in Christ's offering of Himself.

The collection of monetary offerings is our work, hours of our lives and how we are sacrificing it for the work of the Church. Her work is one of charity and evangelization. The bread and wine are called the fruits of creation and history, the fruits of nature combined with human ingenuity. These fundamental symbols are not purely natural symbols, but are in fact the products of the cooperation between the Creator and human beings. Bread and wine are both substances needed to stay alive but also a strong symbol to tell one another that we love one another, we are dependent on one another and that we desire each other to live and be well.

Having placed the gifts into the hands of the priest, from his hands they will be offered to the Father. As water is mixed into the wine, the water represents our poor humanity, which will be completely joined to Christ's divinity, represented by the more precious wine. Washing his hands, the priest asks the Lord to wash him of his iniquity and cleanse him from sin. The hands of the priest now take on a new purpose. Christ will make the hands of the priest his own hands, for there is only one priest, and the hands that take up the gifts, transform them and offer them to the Father are the hands of Christ.

We bring our lives in sacrifice to be joined with the sacrifice of Christ, and the priest urges us to pray that our sacrifice is acceptable to the Father. Our response refers to the priest's hands and our urgent plea that the gifts will be for "the good of all his holy church". The final prayer at this point of the celebration is called the Prayer over the Offering. Although it varies from Sunday to Sunday, feast to feast, it always mentions the gifts, their transformation and ours. Saying "Amen", we are saying "so be it", "so we believe". We now await the biggest prayer of the Church...she exists to pray it and she comes into being by praying it.

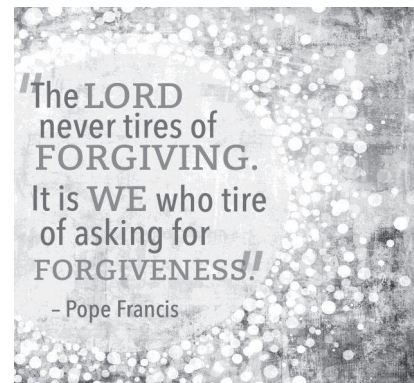
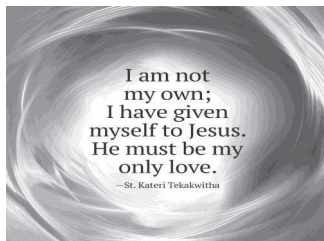
