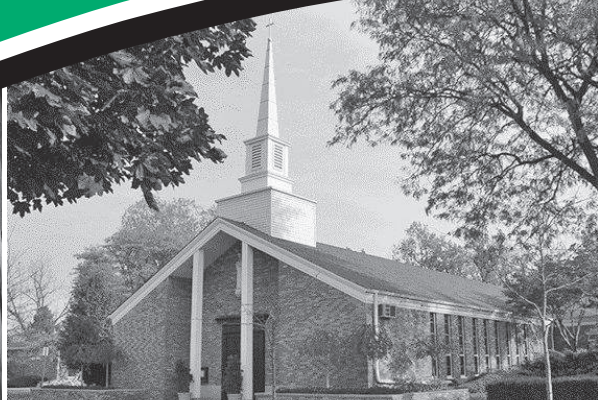

FAITH FORMATION

Every generation throughout the existence of our faith has come back again and again to the celebration of the Eucharist. With each experience of the Eucharistic Prayer, we hope to understand its mystery a little more deeply and to participate in it more wholly, becoming a part of the prayer. The many parts of the Eucharistic Prayer begins with a narrative strand recalling the great event of our Faith, with the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ as its center. These are not just words but also include gestures and signs and an entire elaborate meal in a particular place and with particular people. Whereas the Sacred Scripture may change from Sunday to Sunday and from feast to feast, the Eucharistic Prayer’s center remains the same.

In the opening dialogue of the Preface, the presider and the assembly speak back and forth in three short, ancient exchanges, asking for divine assistance in our prayers. As the prayer continues, it intensifies and is now addressed entirely to God the Father, through the Son and in the Holy Spirit. We ask the Father to send His Son and the Holy Spirit transforming the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of the Son, while at the same time making us one body, one spirit in that Body of the Son. It is then that through the Son and in the Spirit, we, the Church, offer this Body to the Father. We are entered into His Resurrection, where the past He once lived is still present and available to each and everyone of us.

The singing of the heavenly hymn, “Holy, Holy, Holy”, teaches us that we are standing before the throne of God in Heaven, that the earthly event of the cross are a permanent piece of Heaven and that God is coming to us now in the Mass. Kneeling in adoration, we actively participate in what Christ is accomplishing on our behalf. Choosing one of four Eucharistic Prayers, the presider continues to unfold the mystery of our celebration, with the word *sacrifice* essential to our understanding. His words and actions are more for the Father to hear and see than for the congregation. Re-enacting the gestures of Jesus at the Last Supper, our sacrifice of bread and wine is now consecrated. It is under these actions and words that our lives are transformed and we are allowed to become His sacrifice.

Continuing, the “Mystery of Faith” makes us fully aware of the center of our salvation and the *past* event of Jesus’ death, the *present* reality of His Resurrection and his *future* coming in glory. All of which is hidden in what lies on the altar with our Faith witnessing, perceiving and proclaiming as much. We do so in memory of Jesus, as He instructed us to do. And our prayer continues. Once again we call on the Holy Spirit to come down and transform those who receive the gifts of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Lord becomes bodily present in sacramental form so that the Church can be formed as His body. Our intercessions of the Eucharistic Prayer are not just those for ourselves as individuals or just for those of us in the assembly of St. Kateri. We are joined with the whole Church across the world and across the centuries. We pray for the Church without walls and boundaries, *(continued on page 3)*

We add the names of the Pope and our bishop, and all living and deceased, whom we are now in communion with. And in doing so, we express our desire to be one body in Christ with all we have named.

A sense of praising and glorifying God, known as doxology, has been present throughout the Eucharistic Prayer from its start and to its closure bringing it to a full circle. It is the perfect summary of what we have remembered and what we have asked for. Our Amen that closes the Eucharistic Prayer is unending, joined into the eternal Amen of our Faith.

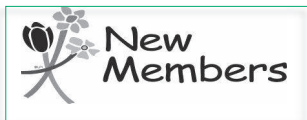

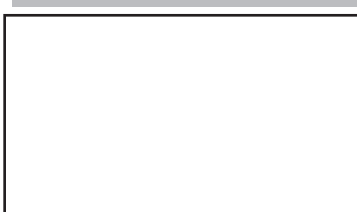

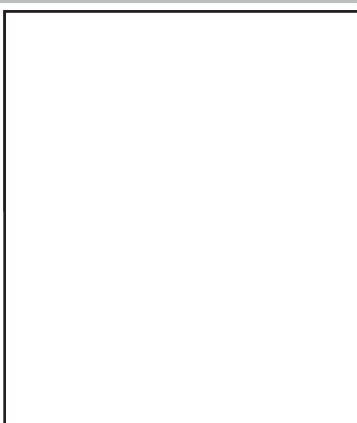
