


Like our Heavenly Father, a good dad just seeks consistently the best for his family. Whether your father is living or deceased it is time this weekend to give thanks for him as he does for you. **HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!**

This father of the parish is on the mend and making progress having received positive news from the cardiologist this past week. He strongly urges me to slow down a bit and take full advantage of the cardiac rehab program begun this past week. I am extremely grateful to Fr. Gary and Deacon Tom, our sacristans and parish staff for taking over the liturgies and the many pastoral responsibilities during these weeks. (I hope to be back to at least a modified mass schedule in July). I also want to express gratitude to all of you who have sent get well cards and messages of support. I read each card with satisfaction and assurance of your prayerful support. Please be patient with me. I am confident that I'll be back to a fuller schedule in the near future. All of us have a lot more living to do!

Your generosity and confidence in St. Kateri parish is appreciated and bearing fruit. As you know three priorities we have as a parish are promotion of vocations to priesthood and religious life, Catholic schools and Christian education, and outreach to the needs of our community. We are being faithful to all three. We have been blessed with generous contributions this year to our Offertory which allows us to be generous to others. Our commitment to the Seminary and our two neighboring schools of St. Sebastian and Sacred Heart, coupled with YOUR generosity, has allowed the parish to give \$5,000 to each of these schools. On their behalf, I thank you.

I also want to report a successful ongoing CSA drive. With only a few weeks into the effort we have exceeded our parish target of \$46,257 by 11%. The \$5,000 plus dollars over the target of course remains in the parish and all contributions are NOT subject to Archdiocesan tax. Donations and pledges can still be made to the CSA via the offertory, by mail or directly to the parish office. **THANK YOU** to all who have contributed thus far.

I want to give everyone a "heads up" regarding the upcoming opportunities for family and individual portraits. This is all a part of creating a parish pictorial directory. The last directory was published in 2010 and it is time for an update. Dates for the portrait-taking are **August 4-6** and **October 6-8**. Check your calendars and make your plans. Details will be forthcoming.

On a final note, our parish grounds have been enhanced with some beautiful landscaping this spring. Of course with expanded flower beds and shrubs comes increased need for weeding and maintaining. You might want to volunteer to take on a small bit of the effort with your own designated bit of

## FAITH FORMATION

No matter the time or the size of the building nor the number of people gathered, when we as Catholics come together to celebrate the Eucharist, the Mass, if you wish, we are joining in with people all over the world. Though language may be different, the Order of the Mass is consisted throughout the world. We could walk into a Catholic Church in Jamaica, Poland, Australia, or just next door in Melvindale and the celebration of the Mass would be the same. Our gathering is multi-focused. We come together “to hear the Word of the Lord, to pray for the world’s needs, to offer the sacrifice of the Cross in praise and thanks to God, to receive Christ Jesus in Communion, and then to be sent forth in the Spirit as disciples of the Gospel” (Sacrosanctum Concilium, No. 10).

The Eucharist is divided into four parts. The Introductory Rites, The Liturgy of the Word, The Liturgy of the Eucharist, and The Concluding Rites. Our celebration as the Body of Christ begins with the simplest prayer, The Sign of the Cross. This is probably the very first prayer that each of us learned. It’s universal gesture and words lets the world know that we hold dear and believe in a Trinitarian faith. This simply means we believe in three persons in one God. After greeting the celebrant, we acknowledge God’s great mercy for us and our own failures and we ask His forgiveness in the Penitential Act. Next, whether sung or recited, the Gloria is an ancient hymn of praise in which the Church prays to the Father. We end this part of the Mass with the Collect. It is called the Collect because it “collects” all the people’s prayers from the Introductory Rites of the Mass into a single prayer said by the priest and serves to express the character of that particular liturgical celebration.

Next time you attend the Eucharist, listen closely to the words of this part of the Mass. Hopefully your open mind and heart will soak in these words with a greater understanding of their meaning and a greater passion in your participation in them.






