This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—better known to most of us as "Corpus Christi". The feast has always been celebrated after the celebrations of Easter, Pentecost and Trinity Sundays. The reason is simple and logical. The Body and Blood of Christ is what sustains us through the year and all our observances and reflections on those profound mysteries of Faith that we call "feasts". Our great and memorable encounters with the mystery of Christ in our lives are evident when we enjoy Christmas, Easter, Pentecost and Trinity Sunday and all the other feasts in the Church's calendar. Corpus Christi is an important reminder of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. But one Sunday celebration does not say it all. The great gift of Eucharist, the core of our practice of the Faith, is embraced every day of the week, every hour in every place around the world. The Church—we Christians—have also been called the Body of Christ. What a gift we have been given in Christ—one certainly we are invited to "re-gift" to one another!

Our parish will celebrate our Patroness' feast day on July fourteenth. Following the 11:00 AM Mass, picnic food, frolic and fun will be celebrated. Translate "frantic" to mean polka music and dancing, a little bingo playing on the side and all topped off with some great picnic foods. Hopefully you can make it. FAITH FORMATION

Summer has officially started! Days are longer, life slows and nature provides us with the sights, sounds and smells of God's glorious creation. What better time to reflect on some of the details of our lives as Catholics. One of the first things we experience as Catholics is the Sign of the Cross, maybe at Baptism or even as a blessing at our birth. "The Sign of the Cross is a sacramental if we make it with the right hand by touching the forehead showing our belief in the Cross, the breast showing our love of the Cross, and the shoulders showing our readiness to bear the Cross. Sometimes a triple Cross is made with the thumb, for example at the reading of the Gospel. It is made on the forehead, on the lips and on the heart to ask God to enlighten our mind, be on our lips and in our hearts." (www.Schmalen.com) The words of the Sign of the Cross vocalized our belief in the Holy Trinity and our asking the Father, Son and Holy Spirit to come down and dwell within us. I hope that the next time you enter the Church, say Grace before your meal or recite your daily rosary, you will say the words and perform the gesture of the Sign of the Cross slowly, respectively, deliberately and reflectively. They are the beginning of our life in Christ.

A DAY IN LANSING

The August 16th (A Day in Lansing) has limited reservations available. If you are interested in joining on this trip, please send in your reservation now.

AN AMERICAN AUTUMN

September 29-October 5, 2019

Gettysburg-Washington-Annapolis-Pittsburg

Reservations are now being taken for the St. Kateri Fall trip which includes several sights you have not visited or would love to revisit. Plan on two nights at the historic GETTSBURG HOTEL (1797) on Lincoln Square, centrally located for the guided tour of the battlefields, museum and Cyclorama. Diner at the FARNS-WORTH HOUSE (1810)-one of the most recognized inns in America—will invite us to capture a deeper sense of the three-day battle through the eyes of Matthew Brady and his photographs.

A short two hour drive from Gettysburg takes us to WASHIGTON, DC and a visit to the NATIONAL SHRINE OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION—one of the ten largest churches in the world. Included with the visit will be a guided tour of the ST. JOHN PAUL SHRINE nearby.

After checking in at our MARIOTT HOTEL for our three day stay we will dine at the iconic UNION STATION before beginning our evening with a guided ILLUMINATED TOUR OF WASHINGTON'S MONUMENTS. The next morning begins with a visit to ARLINGTON CEMETERY and the Kennedy gravesites, the TOMB OF THE UNKNOWN and the CHANGING OF THE GUARD. Afternoon offers a short ride to ANNAPOLIS and guided tour of the NAVAL ACADEMY followed by dinner on the ANNAPOLIS WATERFRONT.

Our final day in our nation's capital invites us to visit the SMITHSONIAN as well as some more recently opened SPY, BIBLE and NEWS MUSEUMS. The day concludes with dinner at the historic GADSBY TAVERN (1785) located in OLD TOWN ALEXANDRIA and visited by no less than the first six Presidents of the United States.

Leaving Washington the next morning we will enjoy the scenic drive to Shanksville, PA and a short visit to the FLICHT 93 MEMORIAL and time for prayer and remembrance of 9/11/01. Later we check into Pittsburgh's SHERATON STATION SQUARE our home for the night. After a short rest we go to dinner at the CHURCH BREW WORKS, a repurposed 1902 church replete with original fixtures, windows and pews.

Our final day is filled with seeing Pittsburgh from the vantage point of the century old DUQUESNE INCLINE and cruising the convergence of the Ohio, Monongahela and Allegheny Rivers aboard the GATEWAY CLIPPER. A stop for lunch and boutique shopping at Pittsburgh's STATION SQUARE gives us respite before beginning our drive home. The time spent together on our return to Dearborn allows time to share stories and anecdotes of a most memorable AMERICAN AUTUMN.


