FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The St. Kateri Parish Financial Report is published in this week's bulletin. The report has been accepted and approved by the Archdiocese. As you can see, we are in pretty good shape! The fiscal year for the parish, like every other parish, runs from July 1 — June 30 and reflects income and expenses for that period. During this fiscal year we received a most generous gift of nearly \$95,000 from the estate of a long time parishioner. We are most grateful for her generousity and love for the parish. Gifts like hers makes it so much easier to maintain ongoing capital improvements as noticed by the Archdiocese and recently reported to you. I want to thank each and every one of you who contributes to the parish. Your support enables us to maintain our buildings, campus, and most importantly all parish services. Thank you again.

Other good news is that our parish Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) met and exceeded its target of \$52,973. Two hundred sixty-seven parishioners pledged a total of \$56,212 with the vast majority of those pledges already paid off. This consistent generosity on your part is in keeping with all past years and certainly speaks highly of St. Kateri Parish. Thank you again for your kind generosity.

We can also be thankful for the 455 folks who have signed the Michigan Right to Life petition to ban dismemberment in the abortion procedure. This gruesome procedure is receiving strong opposition across the state from not only the Catholic community but most religious groups. We have had two weekends for signing the petition and will conclude the effort with the final opportunity next weekend, October 5th & 6th. If you have not already signed the petition please take the opportunity to do.

This past Tuesday I met with our Pastoral Council, staff, sacristans and regular volunteers to explain and introduce the plan for our parish response to emegency situations. Over the summer a panel of very accomplished parishioners with varied backgrounds developed protocols and materials for the plan. With it now in place, I have asked Therese Terns to be our parish Compliance Officer. Her role will be ensuring ongoing evaluation and implementation of the plan in the months and years ahead. We are grateful that she has accepted the position.

Finally, you only have to watch the evening news to know how poorly in many cities our first reponders are treated - especially police officers. We will begin this weekend publishing prayers for all our First Responders. When you see one, give them the thumbs up for their service!

October 3rd - Feast of the Martyrs of La Florida

When we think of Florida, we usually picture vacations, Disneyworld, golf, beaches and retirement (and hurricanes). However, few of us are aware of the fact that the ground of Florida is awash with the blood of martyrs.



In the 1500's, Spanish missioners converted many Apalachee Indians and established vibrant mission communities in and around Florida. But due to their hatred of the Spaniards and the Catholic faith, the British and their Indian allies murdered 13 friars and thousands of men, women and children between 1549 and 1763. These events have been researched, documented and submitted to the Vatican for beatification of 86 of those "Martyrs of La Florida."

Notable among these holy people is Antonio Cuipo, an Apalachee chief, husband, father and church leader who was tied to a cross. He experienced a vision of Mary who comforted him as preached from the cross and then died.

Other martyrs include mother and son, Mariana and Jacinto. Mariana was forced to watch as her son was burnt at the stake before her own death. Another young martyr, Joseph, was clubbed to death while escaping from a burning church. Joseph had been trying to save a ciborium filled with consecrated hosts.
