From the desk of Father Terry Kerner

A new year and a new President and Administration encourages us to look forward in our own lives for both the need and the opportunities for growth in our spiritual life. Static faith never nourishes our daily life but often only leads to a less than vibrant realization of God's presence in our day to day activities. An all pervasive battle with the pandemic also can rob us of a joy that each day can bring. It is one thing to say "this too will pass" but what does one do until it does? I suggest that is where and when daily prayer enters our life. Find a time during the day to pray. Prolonged time on our knees is not really pragmatic but mentally speaking with the Lord while driving to work or mopping a floor is. Bring a conversation with God throughout your day and eventually you will hear Him speaking to you. It brings peace and confidence to your day and a feeling of God spending the day with you. A confidence that you will not ever have to say: "this too will pass"!

I want to encourage folks to consider joining the Blessed Carlo Ministry explained at Mass last weekend. Anyone tech savvy and willing to help us livestream St. Kateri services and activities is encouraged to learn about this ministry. See our friendly organist Kevin after Mass or contact the parish office (313.336.3227). Already seven persons, teens to seniors, have come forward to volunteer.

To all of you who were able to contribute to this year's Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) CONGRATULATIONS are in order. According to the January 15, 2021 report, the combined efforts of the Archdiocesan 213 parishes have achieved ninety percent of the 2020 goal with payments of 88%. The average parishioner participation in each parish is 22.4%. St. Kateri with a goal of \$45,731 has met our goal and exceeded it at 126% with payments at 118%. Our parishioner participation is 48.6% - more than double the average parish and the third highest of all 213 parishes in the Archdiocese. We can all be very proud of our parish and its willingness to work together! The overage will certainly help soften our shortage in the Offertory.

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

It was a normal day by all accounts, but John just wasn't feeling himself. He was a little lightheaded and out of sorts and certainly not himself. Later in the afternoon, he experienced chest a sharp pain in his chest and arm. Quick thinking and action brought John to the Emergency Department with a diagnosis of a significant heart attack. Surviving this ordeal, he found himself face to face with his cardiologist having an honest conversation about things that needed to change. "I came close to death," John found himself thinking. Then came the remorse. He was a young man with a loving wife and children who were very close to facing life without him. John found himself with intense sorrow for living an unchecked and self-indulgent life that almost brought him to his demise. He wanted to change.

We have experiences and encounters that call us to really think twice about choices we have made and directions we have taken. Often, we find ourselves looking at those we have hurt square in the eye and wallowing in our foolishness. We regrettably realize that we have allowed our ego needs to lure us into making some cruel mistakes. We impulsively say things and flippantly do things that reveal our unredeemed and unhealed self. It is a self we stumble over and try to tame but can't quite seem to master and control. Help!

Me spin our wheels naively thinking that we will somehow, perhaps through persistence, get ourselves unstuck. But,



we don't. We just get out of the car, feeling very helpless, and ignorantly look at the mess we got ourselves into. Did we ever think to ask someone for help? Or, taken the advice of One who is wiser and avoid this route altogether? "Come after me," are words that Jesus says to all of us. In order to heed his invitation, we have to leave our ego-self behind and follow. When we really see and understand the freedom, peace, justice, and love he offers, we find ourselves with such sorrow in our hearts for how foolish and silly we have been. All of the misguided choices and sinful actions come full view and we see how risky our random impassioned behaviors really have been. Repentance is beautiful. When done with a sincere and contrite heart, it directs us to the glory that can be ours, ignites us with the challenge of living a life in service of others and reminds us that all is well.

TO REFLECT AND RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

First Reading:

Although initially reluctant to be one of God's prophets, Jonah was ultimately successful in getting the Ninevites to repent of their sins. **When do you find yourself resisting God's will?**

Second Reading:

In trying to awaken a sense of spiritual urgency, Paul taught the Corinthians that Christ's return was imminent and that, "time is running out." How can a sense of urgency aid one's spiritual life?

Gospel:

In Mark's account of the call of the first disciples, Simon (Peter), Andrew, James, and John immediately answer Jesus' call to follow him. **How would you describe your response to Jesus' call in your life?**





As he passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." - Mk 1:16-17

St. Kateri Parish Gift and Book Shop

The Gift Shop is back to it's regular schedule of being open before and after the weekend Masses. Coronavirus protocols are still being followed with masks and safe distancing in the shop.

Although the Feast of Epiphany came upon us very fast this year, the shop still carries home blessing kits. House blessings on or around Epiphany, are prayers to ask God for protection on all who live or visit there. It is an Eastern European tradition also practiced in the Orthodox churches. Incense is lit, symbols are written in chalk on the doorpost and holy water is used as a special house blessing prayer is recited. Our kits include these items along with directions and prayers.

Those of you who purchased these kits in the past may still use them. The only difference is marking the New Year of "21" on the door. The small holy water bottles are refillable in the church vestibules.

TECH WHIZ CARLO ACUTIS BEATIFIED BY CATHOLIC CHURCH

Metro Manila (CNN Philippines, October 11) — Italian computer whiz Carlo Acutis is the first millennial proclaimed "Blessed", after he was beatified by the Catholic Church Saturday in Assisi, Italy.

The teenager, who devoted his life spreading the faith on the internet before dying of leukemia at the age of 15, was beatified in a Mass at the Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi.

Citing a report from the Catholic News Agency, the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines said in its news website that Cardinal Agostino Vallini, the pontifical legate for the Basilica, celebrated the Mass for the beatification ceremony.

Acutis' heart, which now serves as a relic, was placed near the altar of the church.

Pope Francis also read an apostolic letter declaring October 12 as Acutis' feast day, to commemorate his death in Milan in 2006.

In his homily, Cardinal Vallini hailed Acutis for using the internet "in service of the Gospel, to reach as many people as possible.

Before his death, Acutis used his computer programming skills to create a website archiving Eucharistic miracles.

He was designated "Venerable" after the Pope approved a miracle involving the healing of a Brazilian boy who suffered a rare pancreatic disease.

Acutis' body, dressed in casual clothes which he wore in daily life, is currently displayed in a glass tomb in Assisi's Sanctuary of the Spoliation in the Church of St. Mary Major until October 17 for veneration, the report added.

Another verified miracle will be needed before Acutis becomes formally hailed as the "patron saint of the internet."
