#### From the desk of Father Terry Kerner

With the beginning of Lent this coming Ash Wednesday we are all challenged to review our lives with an eye to letting go of selfish attitudes opening our hearts and minds and becoming more aware of God's grace within us. God's presence within us began at our Baptism and continues throughout our lives barring serious sin. Lent is the time to "grow" His grace and celebrate it by appreciating others and caring for them. Lent is also the time to reacquaint in deeper ways the Lord with whom we walk day by day.

Ash Wednesday Masses and distribution of ashes will be celebrated at 9:00 am, Noon, and 5:30pm. Because of COVID protocols ashes will not be marked on our foreheads but be sprinkled on our heads, the actual practice for many centuries in the early church.

Lenten rules for fast and abstinence include not eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays of Lent for all Catholics 14 years or older. For those 18 — 59 years are to observe the fasting practice of not eating between two small meals which do not exceed the main meal. Exceptions for reasons of health can be made. Any questions should be addressed to the pastor or deacon.

As we begin in a few days this holy and serious season let me quote a fellow priest's thoughts on Lent. Fr. Thomas Connery shares this:

"An 87 year old woman was admitted into the hospital. The intake nurse asked, "Has your diet changed?" "Yes" she replied. "For Lent, I gave up whipped cream on my Jello, hard candy and my two beers a night — and look where it got me!" **SO WHERE WILL LENT GET YOU?** If it is only a means to drop a few pounds or quit some uncomfortable habit, then maybe not far enough. There's nothing wrong in losing weight by our fasting, it's an extra bonus. Yet it is not the motivation for our fasting.

We want to be more like Jesus. We want to be better versions of ourselves. Lent is that opportunity. Don't waste it. Choose a Lenten practice for these next 40 days."

Hope to see you in church this coming Wednesday.

My Fellow Catholics,



The Sacred Liturgy, and particularly the Holy Eucharist, is the very heart and foundation of our Catholic faith. It is during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass that the saving death and resurrection of Jesus is made present to us, our covenant with Our Lord is renewed, and God, in the person of Jesus Christ, comes to us and makes himself truly present for us in his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It is an irreplaceable gift; a foretaste of Heaven itself.

When the pandemic first began, it was necessary to suspend all public liturgies. We cautiously returned to Mass with prudent restrictions, such as capacity limits and rigorous cleaning protocols.

As part of our adaptations, many of our parishes have broadcast Masses over the internet during these last several months. While this has been a means to help Catholics nourish their souls when they could not be present for Mass, we must remember that it cannot become the norm. God did not come to us virtually. He came to us — and continues to come to us — in the flesh. As Catholics, unmediated contact with the Real Presence of the flesh and blood of Our Lord in offering this sacrifice to the Father is irreplaceable and essential

In recognition of the essential and central nature of the Eucharist Sacrifice in our lives as Catholics. It is important that I lead more of the faithful back to Mass, when and where possible. That is why the general dispensation from the Sunday obligation will be extended only for one month, until March 13. With its expiration, I intend to grant numerous particular dispensations to those in need.

We know that there remains the concern for spread of infection, particularly among the winter months when we live indoors to a greater degree. With this in mind, I am granting particular dispensations from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation for people in certain circumstances, including those who are ill and those who care for anyone who is at-risk of serious complications from COVID-19. I am making a particular request that those who are ill or think they might be ill to refrain for this in-person participation in the liturgy as an act of justice and charity to others. Those who would experience significant anxiety or fear of getting sick from being in a public setting are similarly dispensed from their obligation to attend.

In allowing the general dispensation to expire, we must welcome back to Mass all Catholics who have been engaged in other activities that would present a similar or greater risk of exposure, such as eating out at restaurants, traveling, partaking in non-essential shopping, and widening one's circle of contacts. These individuals should also prepare to return to Mass in recognition of its preeminence in our lives as Catholics.

The health and safety of our communities is and always will be paramount. I am continuing the liturgical directive that all the faithful present at Mass, wear a mask or face-covering. Our churches will remain limited to no more than 50 percent of available capacity for the near future, and many other existing protocols will remain in place.

At the beginning of this pandemic, I entrusted the Archdiocese of Detroit to Our Lady of Lourdes, patroness for those who suffer illness, asking that, through her intercession, God would grant healing and protection to the people of southeast Michigan and beyond. With Our Blessed Mother's help, let us persevere in hope to face the challenges of this virus and continue to give witness to our confidence in the good news of the Lord's victory over suffering and death.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.



#### **FUN FACTS!**

Leprosy (Hansen's disease) is an infectious disease caused by a slow-growing bacteria. If left untreated, it can cause nerve damage that can result in crippling of hands and feet, paralysis, and blindness. The bacteria that causes leprosy was discovered by G. H. Armauer Hansen in Norway in 1873. The first effective treatment (Promin) became available in the 1940s. In the 1950s, Dapsone was introduced.

#### THE LITTLE BLACK BOOK


