From the Pastor's Desk by Fr. Terry Kerner,

With all the necessary conversation about the coming election it is easy to overlook some important parish activities and events coming up. Though All Souls Day falls on Wednesday, November second we will be celebrating our annual parish Memorial Mass on Saturday, October 29<sup>th</sup> at the 4:00 pm Mass. We like to always have the Memorial at a weekend mass when many can attend. All who have lost loved ones since last All Saints Day are invited to attend and participate. Please keep in your prayer all our parish members who have died this past year.

November is the customary month for remembering the deceased of our families. The Book of Remembrance will be available during the month to record the names of deceased family and friends. A person can do this starting with the holy day Noon or 5:30 pm All Saints Masses on Tuesday, November first. The Gift Shop also has available outdoor cemetery and indoor memorial candles for your convenience.

Of course, Tuesday, November 8<sup>th</sup> is that all important Election Day. Good Catholics are also called to be good citizens who take the privilege of voting seriously. As we have done in past years, Saint Kateri church will be open for private prayer from when the polls open at 7:00 am until they close at 8pm. Our usual Perpetual Help novena and Mass will be celebrated at 6:30 pm.

Our very popular Harvest Dinner resumes this year on November twelfth! Doors open after the 5:00 pm Mass and all are invited. Tickets are required and are available at both the Gift Shop and Parish Office for \$25.00. Newcomers to the parish should know that the ticket price includes beer and wine and a turkey dinner with all the fixings. I think you will enjoy it.

Beginning that weekend St. Kateri will host a three week-long exhibition of Sacred Art portraying Black American Catholics on the road to sainthood. The over sixty pieces of art are accomplishments of African American artists portraying the journeys of faith travelled by their subjects. Lectures celebrating the talents and history of these artists will be given at Noon on Sunday, November 13th by Vicki Figuerra of the Archdiocese and Fr. Henry Sands who will speak the following Sunday also at Noon. The talks and exhibit are open to the public and there is no charge.

And finally on Sunday, November 27<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 pm Bishop Battersby will be here at St. Kateri to celebrate the Commissioning of the Priests and Directors of our newly formed Family of Parishes. Parishioners from all four parishes are invited to attend. Look for more information in the weeks ahead.



#### GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

**GOD KNOWS** 

NO FAVORITES

here is a thing called "false piety." It is when we wear a religious disguise of devotion, attend to our obligations, and outwardly abide by rules while being inwardly unkind, uncharitable, and exclusive.

Wearing the right clothes, saying the proper prayers, being in sacred places, and reading devotional books, those exhibiting false piety craftily try to control others using the pretense of love. The Pharisees, consistently criticized by Jesus, are prime examples. Thinking they are superior to others, they foolishly believe they are better positioned with God and more

worthy of God's attention. Forming an exclusive "club," they divide things between "mine" and "yours" and "us" and "them." They quickly criticize and point out flaws and errors in rituals and thinking. Conformity becomes the first commandment and control is the game's name.

he requirements for "club membership" are clear: do what we do, think what we think, and believe what we believe. Attempting to control others using the lure of "status" or "salvation," they seduce others into thinking that conformity is the only way to holiness. Clinging to "my

beliefs," "my parish," "my way of thinking," they fail to see the more significant relationship with God that is veiled in all of these superficial rules and practices. Shallow, hol-

> low, and empty vessels, they gloss over the more important virtues of justice, mercy, faithfulness, and forgiveness. Sparkling clean on the outside, but dirty on the inside. Spiritual arrogance is a grave sin. It alienates and hurts the little ones, those considered "least" in the kingdom.

od knows no favorites. Everyone

belongs regardless of whether you are an official, bona fide member. Sometimes membership may be a detriment to actually living the Gospel if you're joining the team for the wrong reasons. The genuinely humble ones may not appear to be overly "pious." They may not know all of the proper prayers or abide by all of

the correct rituals, but they know that they are broken and need mercy. There is no shame in being broken. In fact, many things need to be broken in order to be what they truly are! There is a reason Jesus told us to pray in private. It's only between you and God. It is nobody else's business.

#### REFLECT AND RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

#### First Reading:

Sirach teaches us that the Lord hears the prayers of those most vulnerable — the oppressed, the widow, the orphan, and the poor — because God cares deeply about justice. Who do you know in those categories? How can you reach out to them?

#### Second Reading:

In his second letter to Timothy, Paul speaks of his impend-

ing death and in his firm belief that he will receive a just reward for his ministry. When you think about the end of your life — what do you believe will happen to you for eternity?

#### **Gospel Question:**

In the parable of the Pharisee and tax collector, Jesus teaches crowds the proper approach to prayer: "O God, be merciful to me a sinner." What do you think God says in response?
