



St. Alphonsus Legacy Gardens By Fr. Terry Kerner

Preliminary concept - July 2023

1852 saw four acres dedicated to God recognizing His gift to a faithful people. 171 years ago, German farmers, who enjoyed and shared their God-given endowment, saw the Faith grow and flourish in the hearts and souls of thousands in three different centuries. Countless parishioners have witnessed the miracle of growth in the fertile minds of the parish young and have been humbled by the loving dedication of their Adrian Dominican Sisters along with lay teach-

ers and parents. Many years of learning self-discipline and sacrifice have given hundreds the courage to serve their country in the Armed Forces - too many of whom gave the ultimate sacrifice. The 171 years have seen the Faith grow through the good and difficult times. The Knights of Columbus, one among many witnesses to a living faith, in the parish have worked with clergy to nourish and celebrate the richness and relevance of the Catholic faith. Through the decades we have honored the Mother of our Lord turning to her with confidence seeking her intercession in desperate times.

As St. Alphonsus- St. Clement Parish has witnessed the removal of buildings that over the years presented the site and opportunity for extraordinary growth in parishioners young and old. Their love for their Catholic faith down through the decades presented the "soil for learning" and gave the locus for friendships to flourish. Courage and unselfishness were taught through athletics, drama, and a host of extracurriculars were celebrated and enjoyed in these buildings. Unselfish service was lived by clergy and religious who exemplified the Christian call to serve one's neighbor. In its first century from 1852 - 1952, forty-two women entered religious life and over thirty young men stepped forward to be ordained to the priesthood.

The buildings are gone but not the memories. Changes are difficult but should not deter us from moving forward. Our incredibly beautiful church stands as a stunning statement of what we represent. Today the church will now be visible from the corner of Warren and Schaefer. No doubt some citizens of Dearborn have never seen it before. The planning for the development of the site involves multiple phases, conditions and approvals.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

ACCEPT

It's not uncommon to hear people complain that we Catholics often fail in communicating our faith. Fair enough. We can and should improve

there. But it's interesting to notice that Jesus himself was implicitly accused by his disciples of a similar failure. This week in Matthew's gospel they are perplexed that he speaks to the crowds in ambiguous parables. The Lord's rid-


dles leave many people more confused than before. He responds by pointing out that his parables have an intentional dual purpose: to hide (for some) and to reveal (for others) his Gospel: "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted" (Matthew 13:11). Is Jesus being unnecessarily difficult, obscurantist, or, worse, elitist?

o. We have to remember that all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge lie hidden in him (c.f., Col. 2:3). He is the word of God from

heaven to be planted in the earth of our humanity to bear great fruit. However, like a lover delicately pursuing his beloved, we're dealing with a *relationship*, not new data. When we aren't willing to personally accept Jesus into our lives, the "info" of

the Gospel will simply not make sense to us. It'll seem bizarre, esoteric, or like incoherent religious-speak. But when we are willing to accept Jesus into our lives, everything else starts to make sense. When others don't understand the Church or the Lord, let's be patient. Love is patient. Sometimes it has to hide before it is revealed.
