



The meetings usually run a little over an hour. The intention is to make us men like Saint Joseph in our homes and in our families. We men need this because there's not too many chances to pray together as a group of men. Our group meets in the newly remodeled Church on the third Thursday of every month at 7:00 PM. I hope to see all you men at our next meeting on Thursday, May 16<sup>th</sup> at 7 PM.


