Two athletes were recognized as Academic All State, an honor given to those who have participated in a sport for at least three years while maintaining a 3.5 GPA while in high school; students are incorporating their cultural heritage in the weekly Wöiwahoye Gluötkunzapi pod cast; the middle school science fair filled the gymnasium; and elementary students are reading--25,000 minutes so far and adding more each day. And practically 100% of the senior class has been accepted to at least one college or university (with one senior following his father's footsteps and enlisting in the Marines). Thank you for all you are making possible.

The hope you are providing comes in many forms: over 1,000 healthy meals served each day to hungry children; buses that travel hundreds of miles each day across the prairie roads and highways, teachers and counselors who help their students work towards their dreams, and pastoral help in times of need.

This light of hope could not shine or be so bright without your generous heart and caring. Every day you are raising the horizon of hope! Thank you!




