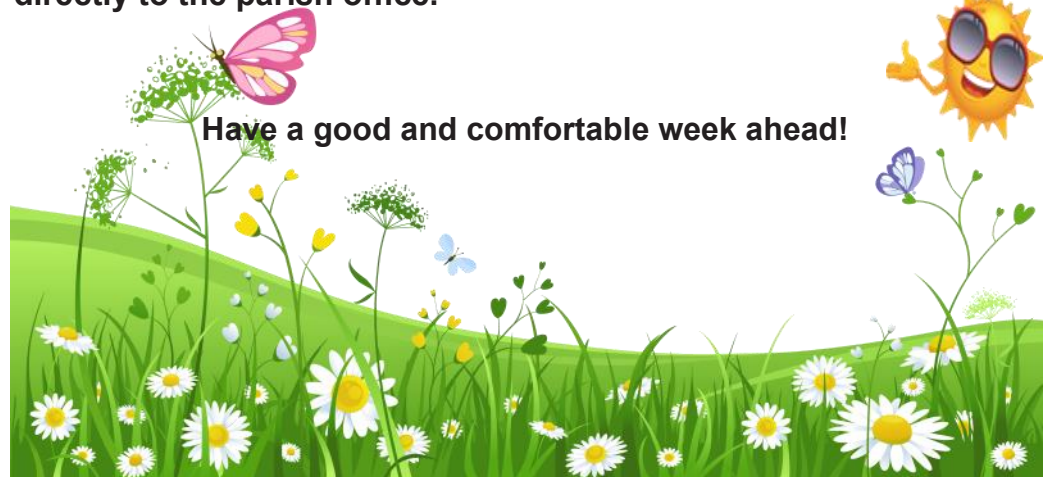
From the Pastor's Desk by Fr. Terry Kerner,

With the high temperatures and humidity, I am hoping that everyone is exercising common sense when it comes to attending Mass on the weekends. Our parishioners are for the most part very faithful in attending Mass, but, if you have not noticed, some are up in years and vulnerable to upper respiratory and other health issues. We need to look out for one another, especially our seniors.

The weather this past week gives us reason to be thankful for the loyal service of our aging air conditioning in the church. It has served us well over the past few decades but is on its proverbial "last leg" and ready to retire. Pray God we can get the new unit up and running soon. We have studied three bids and accepted what we feel to be the most energy and cost efficient. The new unit with installation will run around \$41 K. We will be withdrawing from our savings to cover the cost. However, the CSA is currently at 119% which means that \$9,327 will remain in the parish and will apply to the cost of the project. Thank you to all who are supporting the CSA this year.

Donations can still be made through the mail, the offertory, or directly to the parish office.

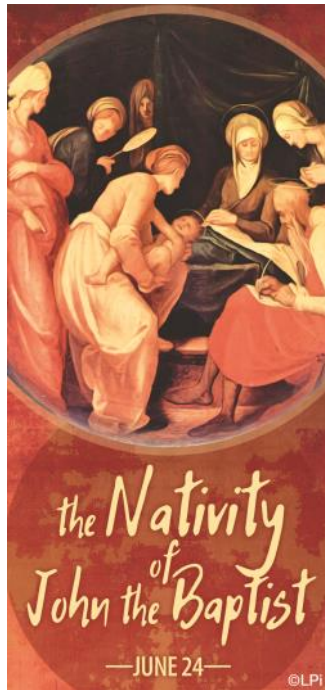


OUTDOOR ROSARY MAY THRU OCTOBER

Why does the Church celebrate the Nativity of John the Baptist?

Only three birthdays are celebrated on the Church's liturgical calendar, the Nativity of Our Lord (December 25), the Nativity of His Mother (September 8), and the Nativity of His forerunner, John the Baptist, on June 24.

Saint John the Baptist was set apart from the womb to prepare the way of the Lord and was a significant figure connected to the Incarnation and the Redemption. The Church honors him because of his role in preparing the way for Christ.

Malachi prophesied the birth of this child, John the Baptist, calling him the messenger who would clear the way for another Messenger.

St. John the Baptist is the Patron Saint of Baptism.

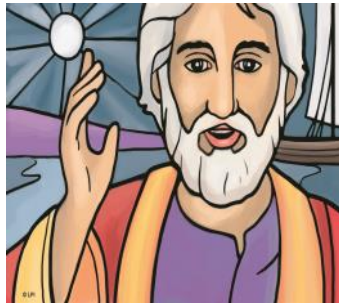

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Right now, you and I are only worried about one of only two things: wind or water. Bear with me. This week we hear the account of the terrified disciples waking Jesus in a sea-storm. He chastises them for their lack of faith, and then, **“rebuking the wind, he said to the sea, ‘Quiet, be still!’”** He rebukes the wind and stills the water. In the Bible wind and water represent the two most fundamental poles of our experience of creation. Wind means heaven, spirit, that which gives identity, unity, order, light. Water stands for earth, variation, potential, that which can be drawn into identity, darkness, chaos.

Too much “wind” is when things get way too rigid, abstract and ideological — when we face oppressive leaders and tyrants, when we get addicted to our own way of doing

things, when our attention is too narrowly focused on one thing. Too much “water” is excessive novelty, passivity, indifference, and chaos - when our attention is too broadly diffused on many things, when things seem to be crumbling without direction into the dark abyss. We know both terrifying experiences all too well.



The point of the miracle is that God in Christ is the One who brings final cosmic harmony between these two vital but threatening forces. He ultimately does so from the wood of the cross, when he breathes forth the wind of his spirit and pours forth the water from his side to establish a new creation, filled with harmonious peace. When the wind and water are out of control, trust him.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

So often when we are weathering the storm, it feels like God is asleep — but we never even tried to wake Him up! Bring God your fears, your doubts, your uncertainties. He will show you that He steers the ship, and even the wind and the seas obey.

REFLECT AND RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

First Reading:
God challenges Job not to question His power over creation. **Have you ever challenged or questioned God in prayer?**

Second Reading:
Paul speaks of believers in Christ as a “new creation.” **In what ways do you sense something new in your life as a Christian?**

Gospel:
The disciples feared for their lives while caught in a violent storm until Jesus calmed the wind and the sea. **When has your faith in Jesus helped calm your fears?**

Prayer for Inner Peace

Jesus, Speak your command of “Quiet! Be still!” into the dark recesses of my mind - my fears, concerns, and anxieties. Be with me, at every moment, no matter the storm. Fix my eyes upon you. Amen.




STS. PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

Paul wrote the majority of the New Testament, with 13 letters ascribed to his name (most scholars agree that 7 are objectively his, yet the other 6 are of contested authorship).
