

#### WHO IS MARY MAGDALENE?

July 22 is the feast of Mary Magdalene. I've heard a lot of stories about her, but who was she really?

Mary Magdalene has been the subject of speculation and scholarship over the last 2,000 years. Mary Magdalene makes her first named appearance in Luke 8:2. She is one of several women following Jesus. Luke specifically mentions that Mary had previously been delivered from demonic possession. Whatever her life looked like before she met Jesus, it wasn't good! Because of this association with being a repentant sinner, Mary Magdalene has been associated with other similar stories in the Gospel, such as the woman caught in adultery or the woman who bathes Jesus' feet with her tears.

Mary Magdalene shows up again by name at the end of the Gospels, when she stands with the Blessed Virgin Mary at the foot of the Cross. Mary is also present in the garden of the resurrection. She is one of the women who goes to bring spices to Jesus' tomb, where they find the stone rolled away. Mary stays in the garden weeping, believing his body has been stolen. Jesus approaches her and calls her by name, and she becomes the first witness to the resurrection! While many of the details of Mary Magdalene's life have been lost to time, she is an example of powerful conversion, deep faith, and intimate love for Christ.



#### A GOSPEL MEDITATION - Lk 10:38-42

In the story of Martha and Mary, we are often left questioning why Martha was admonished for serving the Lord and the guests, which is undoubtedly a noble act in itself.

artha's misstep was not in her service, but in allowing comparison and pride to cloud her intentions. Instead of dedicating her work solely for the glory of God, she became preoccupied with measuring herself against Mary & seeking validation for her actions. Her gift of service, once meant to be selfless, became tainted by the sin of pride.

n the other hand, Mary's focus was solely on Christ, spending time with Him, and honoring Him. Her intentions were pure, centered on love and devotion to the Lord. It was not, that Mary's actions were inherently better,



In our own lives, let us reflect on Martha's lesson and strive to serve with humility and pure intentions, not seeking recognition or validation from others, but dedicating our actions solely for the glory of God.



In life, there are so many "Marthas" — people and situations that distract us from God. But if we imitate Mary and sit calmly at the feet of Jesus, his Word will guard our hearts from the anxiety of the world.



July 26 is the feast of Joachim and Anna. Sts. Joachim and Anna are the parents of Mary, the mother of Jesus, yet there is no biblical reference to them. Their names are found in an apocryphal (hidden) gospel known as "The Infancy Gospel of James." The church has always had a




feast that honored the presumed grandparents of Jesus. While their names are part of non-inspired apocryphal legends, the fact of the Savior's human ancestry is not. Christ, the incarnate Word, dwelt among us in the flesh in a human family. In honoring the grandparents of Jesus we really proclaim our faith in the Incarnation - God becoming human!
