Our Faith Formation Program got off to a good start last Monday with Registration and Orientation. Parents can still enroll their children by calling the parish office at St. Kateri and attending class this coming Monday at 5:30pm. Our Director for Faith Development, Larry Winey is very hopeful for all families with school-age children to attend. New to the team is retired Deacon Tim Pilon who has considerable experience with Religious Education and speaks Spanish as well. We welcome him to the program.

Deacon Tom will again be directing the Order of Christian Initiation (OCIA). This program is for adults considering Baptism and joining the Church. It also facilitates adults who have been baptized but have not been introduced to the Eucharist or been confirmed. Last year Deacon Tom's class ushered into a fuller faith life with nineteen folks — average age twenty-four years.

Deacon is also offering a Scripture Class on the Gospel of Matthew also offered on Mondays beginning on October 6th. Sessions run from 5:45 - 7:15pm. like the OCIA program you can register by calling the parish office at 313.336.3227.

Beginning this weekend in the bulletin we will be highlighting the story of the first millennial saint, Carlo Acutis who was canonized last Sunday by Pope Leo. Each segment of his story leads up to the Vatican Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles that St. Carol researched. His work will be displayed at St. Kateri October 4th 1 2th and is open to the public. Carlo Acutis died of leukemia at age 15, our first Millennial Saint.

Getting to know St. Carlo, our first millenial saint

Carlo Acutis was born May 3, 1991, in London, where his father was working. Just a few months later, he moved with his parents, Andrea Acutis and Antonia Salzano, to Milan, Italy.

From a young age, Carlo had a special love for God, even though his parents weren't especially devout. Antonia Salzano, his mom, said that before Carlo, she went to Mass only for her first Communion, her confirmation, and her wedding.

As a young child, Carlo loved to pray the rosary. After he made his first Communion, he went to Mass as often as possible at the parish across from his elementary school. Carlo's love for the Eucharist also inspired a deep conversion for his mother. According to the postulator promoting his cause for sainthood, he "managed to drag his relatives, his parents to Mass every day. It was not the other way around; it was not his parents bringing the little boy to Mass, but it was he who managed to get himself to Mass and to convince others to receive Communion daily."

Carlo's witness of faith as a child led adults to convert and be baptized. Rajesh Mohur, who worked for the Acutis family as an au pair when Carlo was young, converted from Hinduism to Catholicism because of Carlo's witness. Carlo taught Mohur how to pray the rosary and told him about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Mohur said one of the things that most impressed him as a non-Christian was the witness of Carlo's love and concern for the poor — how he interacted with the homeless man who would sit at the entrance of the church and would bring Tupperware dishes filled with food out to people living on the streets.



Carlo was fascinated with computer coding and taught himself some of the basic coding languages, including C and C++. He used his computer skills and internet savvy to help his family put together an exhibition on Eucharistic miracles that has gone on to be displayed at thousands of parishes on five continents. His spiritual director has attested that Carlo was personally convinced that the scientific evidence from Eucharistic miracles would help people to realize that Jesus is really present in the Eucharist and come back to Mass. 

GOSPEL MEDITATION **ENCOURAGE DEEPER** UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE The Exaltation of the Holy Cross John 3:13-17

One of my favorite movies is the 1991 comedy What About Bob? Bill Murray plays a troubled, paranoid hypochondriac named Bob Wiley who innocently but annoyingly hounds Dr. Leo Marvin, played by Richard Dreyfuss. Bob is paralyzed by his fear of, well, everything, and is convinced the psychologist can heal him. But Dr. Marvin's failed attempts to heal Bob end up driving the doctor to attempt to murder Bob. He fails. The surprise is that, having faced death head on, Bob is suddenly healed. He attributes his healing to Dr Marvin for break-through "death therapy." In facing the cause of his deepest illness and dysfunction, Bob is healed.

Underneath this light-hearted comedy is a dead-serious resonance with this week's feast: the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Christ is lifted up on the cross to force us to face the truth of sin and death. In that reckoning we find healing. Like Moses' snake on a pole, the cross says: this is what is causing your sickness - rebellion, disobedience, sin. Look at it! Don't run from it. Now seeing it exposed, we see life. We see our physician mercifully healing us. In this sense, we are all like Bob Wiley. The "death therapy" of the cross is our only hope for healing.

This week I invite you to "exalt the cross." If you don't have one in your house, get one. Use it for prayer. Gaze on it frequently. It teaches us to not be afraid. It heals us. - Father John Muir
