As we heard last weekend, a restructuring of the Archdiocese will be taking place over the next two years. In the SPRING of 2026, each parish will hold two listening sessions for parishioners to input their opinions for the pastoral models under consideration. Dates for the sessions will be announced in early 2026. Next SUMMER the feedback from the parish sessions will be used to refine the pastoral models and then presented to the Archbishop for his discernment. In the SPRING of 2027, the decisions regarding each parish will be announced as well as the assignments of our priests. The SUMMER of 2027 will see the implementation of the new structure effective July 1, 2027.

The Archbishop is committed to the transparency of the process and hopes for the prayer and participation of all our parishioners. Every step of the restructuring will be covered in the DETROIT CATHOLIC, the Archdiocesan free online news source. Prayer is essential. Non-selfish prayers for the guidance of the Holy Spirit is essential for wise decision making over the next two years. Beginning with Advent and the start of the new liturgical year we will be praying at each mass for the wise and compassionate implementation of the process ahead. Let us support one another in our Faith.

This weekend as we begin Advent, we realize a two-fold character to the season. It is obviously a preparation for the solemnities of Christmas and the First Coming of Christ in time to humanity. Advent is likewise an awareness and appreciation of the Second Coming of Christ at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight!

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

A few years ago, my house was broken into on Super Bowl Sunday. Turns out, it's a great day for burglars. If the TV isn't on, people are probably watching the game somewhere else, so ... easy pickins'. I'll never

forget walking into my bedroom and realizing someone had been there. My stuff was thrown all over the floor. The closet was torn apart. It was disorienting and disturbing — someone had invaded the space I thought was secure. After that, I bought an alarm system. And every Super Bowl Sunday since, I'm extra careful to lock the doors and keep the lights on. That experience made me more alert. Not scared. Just attentive.

That's much like the spiritual place Jesus wants us to be on this first Sunday of Advent. He doesn't start the season with soft candlelight and cozy manger scenes. He starts with two brutal images: a flood and a thief. In other words, chaos and violation.

Why? Because life will flood us. Chaos will come. And in the midst of it, Christ will come like a thief — not to steal from us, but to steal us back. He is the intruder we should want. The one who breaks in, not to ransack, but to rescue.

Christ presents himself as the thief but also the new Noah. He builds the ark of the Church to carry us through the flood. And he invites us to join him. How? By participating fully in our parishes. By making our homes places of prayer. By guarding our hearts with truth. By refusing to let spiritual complacency leave us exposed. By repentance.

This Advent, don't just stay vaguely "awake." Prepare. Build. Watch. The flood will come. But so will he. — Father John Muir

1st Reading Question:


The prophet Isaiah envisioned a future with no more wars and nations united in belief and worship of Israel's God. What does a world totally at peace look like?
